Car Boot Sale: General Terms and Conditions

1. **Event Registration:** All vendors who would like to participate in the car boot sale by selling their second-hand items that are in good to great condition, can now purchase their tickets via Quicket for only R70 per parking bay (exc booking fee): www.quicket.co.za/events/373383-the-ultimate-car-boot-sale-may-2026/. Vendors can book more than one parking bay via Quicket by either increasing at/before checkout.

2. All vendors should adhere to good thrift-Manship, we will not tolerate unethical behaviour. No reselling of fellow vendors' goods will be allowed. We reserve the right to remove any vendor from the premises who does not adhere to these rules and guidelines.
3. **Booth Allocation:** Booth allocation will either be determined by the coordinator, Laretha Blom, on the day of the event to vendors or on a first come, first serve basis that depends on the number of vendors booked. Vendors must adhere to their assigned booth location and size/parking bay that was booked for. For example: if you booked one bay, do not exceed past that bay unless you had booked for more.
4. **Setup and Takedown:** Vendors are responsible for setting up and dismantling their booths within the specified timeframes provided by Okavango Crossing. Booth setup must be completed at 9 am of the commencement of the car boot sale, and vendors must ensure their booths are dismantled promptly after the event.
5. **Product Restrictions:** Strictly second-hand items are allowed to be sold at all Car Boot Sale events. Vendors are not allowed to sell any products in direct competition with our tenants at Okavango Crossing. For example, no dried fruit and nuts as we do have a Montagu. No food is to be prepared on the premises.
6. **Cleanliness and Safety:** Vendors must maintain a clean and safe booth environment throughout the event. Vendors are responsible for the removal of any waste or debris generated by their booth. There will be NO consumption of alcohol within the trading hours of the Car Boot Sale.
7. **Insurance and Liability:** Vendors participating in the car boot sale at their own risk. Okavango Crossing or its staff is not liable for any loss, damage, or injury that may occur during the event.
8. **Compliance with Rules:** Vendors must comply with all rules and regulations set forth by Okavango Crossing. Failure to adhere to these terms and conditions may result in the removal of the vendor from the event.
9. **Cancellation Policy:** In the event of unforeseen circumstances or inclement weather, Okavango Crossing reserves the right to cancel or reschedule the car boot sale. Vendors will be notified of any changes as soon as possible.



10. **Governing Law:** These terms and conditions shall be governed by and construed under the laws of the jurisdiction. Any disputes arising out of or relating to these terms and conditions shall be subject to the exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of [Jurisdiction].

By participating in the car boot sale, vendors acknowledge that they have read, understood, and agree to abide by these terms and conditions.
